## About the Program

Although the goal of every clinician is to preserve organ and organ function with laryngeal and hypopharyngeal cancer patients, total laryngectomy is often at times unavoidable in patients with advanced and recurrent disease. Fortunately, the quality of life following a total laryngectomy is very good provided surgical and rehabilitation efforts are optimal. Over the last several decades considerable progress in voice, pulmonary and olfaction rehabilitation of the total laryngectomy patient has been made. This course will share current trends and practices in post-laryngectomy rehabilitation.

A cadaver demonstration session offers attendees a unique and powerful learning experience on surgical techniques for total laryngectomy. Additionally, a hands-on session with patient/volunteers provides registrants the opportunity to learn techniques of tracheoesophageal prosthesis replacement, HME and Hands free placement.

## Who should attend

Otolaryngologists / Head & Neck Surgeons, Residents, Speech Pathologists, Head & Neck Oncology Nurses.

This two day course is composed of a series of lectures, cadaver demonstrations and patient demonstrations. It is of interest to anyone wishing to expand clinical knowledge of the laryngectomy patient.

Participants attending will receive a comprehensive equipment sample pack & participation in cadaver dissection component.

## Keynote Speakers

### **PROFESSOR FRANS HILGERS, MD PhD**

Graduated from the Medical Faculty of the University of Utrecht in 1973. He completed his Otolaryngology-residency at the Academic Wilhelmina Hospital of the University of Amsterdam and his Head and Neck Fellowship at the Netherlands Cancer Institute in Amsterdam, 1977-78. From 1989 to 2009 he was chairman of the Department of Head and Neck Oncology and Surgery. He also holds a position as consultant for Head and Neck Surgical Oncology at the Academic Medical Hospital of the University of Amsterdam. In 2003 he was appointed as Professor at the University of Amsterdam (Institute of Phonetic Sciences) for 'Oncology related voice and speech disorders, especially in laryngectomized individuals'. His clinical research focuses on postlaryngectomy vocal, pulmonary, and olfactory rehabilitation. As of September 1, 2009, he has laid down his chairmanship of the department, to focus for the remainder of his professional career on a special head and neck rehabilitation project, 4 PhD projects and national and international teaching.
